Course aims

Acquiring, developing and adopting general theoretical and legal knowledge of law and state, acquiring basic knowledge on the application of rights and legality, interpretation of legal norms and their application, adoption of theoretical and legal knowledge on other branches of rights of importance for security studies.

Course outcome

It is expected that the student: understand the origin, structure and essence of the state and rights; basic legal concepts, as well as their elements and types; acquire ability of legal consideration and argumentative discussion of legal issues; adopt basic legal knowledge about the application of law in real social relations, develop skills of interpreting legal norms, and also adopt basic knowledge about different legal disciplines of relevance for security studies.

Course content

Theory classes - Introduction; 1. The concept of law; 2. Legal order and legal system; 3. Legal relationship and subjects of law; 4. Application of law and interpretation of rights; The concept of the state; 6. Concept and elements of state forms; 7. State organization; 8. The notion, formal sources and subjects of international law; 9. Basic rights, obligations and responsibilities of the state in international public law; 10. Rules of international contract law; 11. International organizations; 12. Fundamentals of European Union law: 13. Basics of International Commercial Law: 14. Fundamentals of State aid law and energy security: 15. Fundamentals of the Environmental law.

Teaching methods				

Teaching takes place through lectures and exercises.
