Course aims

To examine and evaluate the student's ability in self-written expression and theoretical and practical design of the selected topic through professional elaboration and system analysis according to the given conditions and the theses for processing.

Course outcome

To carry out study in the chosen topic by integrating knowledge gained through required and elective courses studied during schooling, as well as practical experiences of the student gained during the realization of professional practice. Systematize, identify and expand the acquired knowledge in the chosen topic, and in particular through the development of the thesis. Adopt adequate conclusions based on the given conditions and perform a comparative analysis with the achievements in the security area. Development of ability for stylistic expression of the student and confidence in one's own abilities.

Course content

The final paper represents the independent work of the student in which he/she becomes introduced with the methodology of collecting and analyzing data and solving concrete problems in the security area. Phases of final work: analysis and understanding of the selected topic of final work, collection and processing of literature in the chosen topic (primary and secondary), possible experimental or practical work, analysis and discussion of collected data or experimental results, proposing and selecting the most favorable solution to the problem, making appropriate conclusions and writing the paper. Student prepares final work in written and electronic format with the following structure: Title, Contents, Introduction, Main part, Conclusion, References and Attachments. The number of pages for the final work (with attachments) should be in the range of 40 to 50 pages.

Teaching methods

Student suggests or chooses the topic of final work from more than one offered. In the chosen topic, in cooperation with the mentor, he compiles the basic theses for the elaboration of work. In addition, the mentor defines the dynamics of workmanship, orienteering deadlines and consultation time. After the work of the supervisor and the consent of the mentor that the work has been successfully completed, the candidate defends the work before the commission, which consists of at least three members. The defense of the final work is public, and the student is obliged to oral answer to the questions asked after the presentation of the work.
