Course aims Acquiring knowledge about political violence and terrorism as a modern way of compromising the security of the state and society, as well as the necessary knowledge about the aspects of planning organization and achieving defense against terrorism and organized crime.			
Course outcomes Defining the causes of terrorism, its holders, in particular their organization and fanaticism, forms of manifestation, strategies and tactics in the function of reaching the ultimate goal and opposing all forms of organized crime.			
Course content <i>Theory classes</i> The content of theory classes consists of: conceptual determination of terrorism and terror and basic characteristics of terrorism, strategies and tactics of terrorists, basic classification of terrorism and conflicts with organized crime, concept and characteristics of terrorist act, sociological - psychological factors of terrorism, normative - theoretical assumptions of defense against terrorism, structural elements of the national security system, the functioning of the anti-terrorist system, the importance of engaging target forces for the fight against terrorists. <i>Practice classes</i> In the framework of practice classes case studies of the most significant terrorist acts, computer simulations, security counterterrorism assessments, planning of security procedures for the protection of micro-locations from terrorism will be conducted.
